Blessings for you and yours for an abundant Autumn!

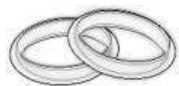

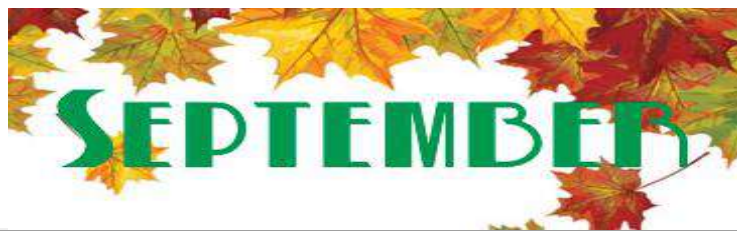
