From the Pastor:

January 2018

2018 will be a year of major change for both Heritage and for me as I retire after 40 years of ministry. I was ordained June 11, 1978, and started my first call on July 15, 1978, in Coldwater Kansas. On June 1, 2018 I will have been the pastor at Heritage for 24 years, having started at Heritage on June 1, 1994. I announced earlier that I would retire at the end of June 2018 or possibly before. Because of the General Assembly meeting in June, I have decided to retire on May 31, 2018. Since the last Sunday in May is Memorial Day weekend and the day of Lincoln Public Schools' graduations, I will be preaching my last sermon on Sunday, June 3.

At the November meeting of Homestead Presbytery, I was reelected as the presbytery's stated clerk for another three-year term and will continue in that role. Once I retire from Heritage, I will not be worshiping at Heritage or be involved in any way with Heritage. That is a necessary boundary, which must be respected by any former pastors of churches, and is part of the policies of Homestead Presbytery. The ministry of a church can be hampered by former pastors intruding, or maintaining relationships with members of the church.

Homestead Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) will be working with the session and the church during the transitional time and in seeking new pastoral leadership. A liaison from COM met with the Session on November 21 to provide information. Session had a special meeting on December 19 to continue the conversation with the liaison, and to "get the ball rolling."

Session may hire an interim pastor who would begin shortly after my retirement, depending upon availability. An interim may work for a year or longer as the church seeks new pastoral leadership. An interim is hired by the Session and does not require a vote by the congregation. Interims are trained and their purpose is to help a church make the transition between pastors. Session could simply hire a stated supply, who plays no role in leading the church through a transitional process.

A concern is whether Heritage can afford a full-time, seminary-trained, installed Minister of Word and Sacrament, the official term for pastors in the Presbyterian Church. Heritage has not been able to meet the budget for quite a few years now. The last two years were ended with about a \$30,000 shortfall. It looks like the deficit for 2017 may be even larger. Heritage is using the principal of our endowment funds. If Heritage continues as it has been doing, the endowment funds could be gone in 5 or 6 years.

There are other options for pastoral leadership. A church can share a pastor with another church or hire a part-time Minister of Word and Sacrament. Another option is to hire a commissioned pastor (CP). A CP is not a Minister of Word and Sacrament, but an elder who has been trained and is authorized by the presbytery to pastor a church. A presbytery can authorize a CP to officiate at the sacraments at that particular church. There may be other options. Again, the presbytery will work with Heritage in seeking pastoral leadership..

Session will be keeping you informed as things process.
