From the Pastor:

March 2018

A group of high school LBGTQIA students have been looking for a place to gather periodically. Some representatives of that group met with the session and, after some discussion, session decided to allow the group to meet in our fellowship hall. (Like we do with all outside groups, there are some rules that the group must follow.) The session sincerely believed this was a way for Heritage Church to extend God's hospitality and to provide these youth with a safe and welcoming place to gather. On March 3, 5:30 to 8:30 PM, they will have a soup supper for a fundraiser in fellowship hall. I hope you come and support them.

Dr. Mark Achtemeier will be joining us on the weekend of March 17 and 18. Dr. Mark Achtemeier is a Presbyterian writer, minister and theologian. After beginning his ministry as a conservative Christian activist who fought against LGBT inclusion, he experienced a change of heart that has led to his playing a prominent role in recent years in helping the Presbyterian Church (USA) become more open and accepting toward LGBT Christians. Mark will share some of the story of his transformation when he joins us on March 17th, at 6:00 PM in Fellowship Hall. On the following day, Sunday, March 18 he will be preaching at our morning worship.

Mark's story is presented in more detail in his 2014 book, titled *The Bible's Yes to Same-Sex Marriage*, which tells the uncommon story of how a pastor with a high regard for the authority of Scripture could come to believe, through years of careful study, that traditionally negative Christian attitudes toward homosexuality are the result of long-standing misinterpretations of the Bible. Even more striking, he now believes that a persuasive biblical case can be made to support same-sex marriage. Copies of his book will be available for purchase at the event.

In addition to his work on sexuality issues, Mark has traveled widely as a conference speaker, he has served as an official representative of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in both ecumenical and interfaith dialogues. Mark taught theology and ethics for fifteen years at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary and has served pastorates in Virginia, North Carolina and Iowa. A native of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, Mark holds degrees from Harvard College, Union Presbyterian Seminary and Duke University. He currently resides in Dubuque with his wife Kat, also a Presbyterian minister, and together they have three grown children and three grandchildren, with an additional grandchild on the way in July.

On Sunday, March 25, Bryce Wiebe will be our guest preacher. Bryce is manager of Special Offerings for the Presbyterian Mission Agency. As manager of Special Offerings, Wiebe leads a four-member staff responsible for promoting the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s four Special Offerings and the causes they support. The four offerings include One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost, Peace and Global Witness, and Christmas Joy. Following the worship, there will be a pot-luck dinner in Fellowship Hall, where Wiebe will give an informal presentation on the ministry of the four special offerings.

Wiebe is a Nebraska native, earning a bachelor of arts in music and business administration from Hastings College and a master of divinity degree from Yale Divinity School.

I hope you will join us for these events.
