*From the Pastor:*

*May 2017*

In this newsletter is an invitation to a class I will be teaching on discipleship. I originally was going to call it a “new member” class, but I prefer using this the word “discipleship.” “Membership” conjures up the image of institutional survival, of keeping an organization going. We need more members to keep our church going. More members mean more volunteers to get the work done that needs to get done and more money to pay the bills and keep the institution going. Thinking of membership in those terms tends to place the focus on the wrong things. In today’s secular world, we evaluate institutions by their size. The more employees a corporation has, the more net sales a corporation has in a year, the better. To be listed as a Fortune 500 company is seen as a bragging point. The Fortune 500 is an annual list compiled and published by Fortune magazine that ranks 500 of the largest U.S. corporations by total revenue.

Membership in the church should not be about institutional survival or numbers. It is about discipleship. If when using the terms membership in the church, we are talking about discipleship, then I am willing to use that term.

The *Book of Order* (constitution) of the Presbyterian Church reads, “Membership in the Church of Jesus Christ is a joy and a privilege. It is also a commitment to participate in Christ’s mission (G-1.0303).” The paragraph goes on to list what such involvement includes. I want to list them for you, to give you some idea what discipleship means in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

Such involvement includes:

- proclaiming the good news in word and deed,
- taking part in the common life and worship of a congregation,
- lifting one another up in prayer, mutual concern and active support,
- studying Scripture and the issues of Christian faith and life,
- supporting the ministry of the church through the giving of money, time and talents,
- demonstrating a new quality of life within and through the church,
- responding to God’s activity in the world through service to others,
- living responsibly in the personal, family, vocational, political, cultural, and social relationships of life,
- working in the world for peace, justice, freedom, and human fulfillment,
- \*caring for God’s creation,*
- participating in the governing responsibilities of the church, and
- reviewing and evaluating regularly the integrity of one’s membership, and considering ways in which one’s participation in the worship and service of the church may be increased and made more meaningful.

(\*The 2016 General Assembly (national meeting) asked the presbyteries to add this to the meaning of membership. It has been overwhelmingly ratified by the presbyteries.)

If one chooses to participate in the Presbyterian Church, but not be a member, they are “welcome and may participate in the life and worship of the church and receive its pastoral care and instruction (G-1.0404).” Basically, the only difference is that if one is not a member, one cannot vote in congregational meetings or be elected to office in the congregation.

The class will include a brief history of the church universal, of Heritage Church, and an explanation of Presbyterian polity (government) and what makes the Presbyterian Church unique from other churches as well as what we all have in common. The class is scheduled for Wednesday nights, June 7, 14, and 21, at 7:00 P.M., in the Gibson Room, and will go no later than 8:30 P.M. There will be refreshments.

This class is for those who are interested in joining the church, for members—or anyone-- wanting to know more about discipleship in the Presbyterian Church.

### DUCS (YOUTH GROUP NEWS)


The DUC's learned the meaning behind various parts of the PC(USA) symbol. You can see this amazing art along with the different meanings in the Narthex.
