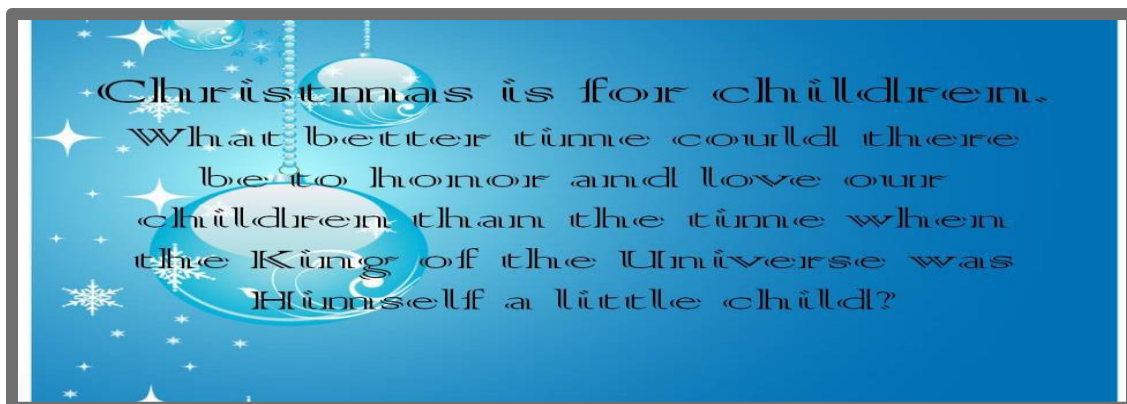
I'd love to taste a cuppa Christmas Tea with you! Do you have time?

I've already told you some of mine: we 4 J's coming in to the living room in reverse order Christmas morning; the ceramic angel from Germany carefully hung over the ten foot pinon tree in the corner of the big, old room with the wood fireplace warming us. But there are scores of other memories, maybe even hundreds. Gram (who was ½ German) brought rich traditions of Santa arriving at midnight and he brought the tree, fully decorated (the first time the children saw the tree it sprang alive full of lights and ornaments and tinsel on Christmas morning). Gram also made Christmas cookies (thirteen dozen each of thirteen different kinds; it took her all of November and early December to get them done; we kids LOVED helping her. She carefully stored them in white, dairy bins in the cool pantry until unpacking them around December 6 and then putting them in Christmas tins (carefully arranged so everyone got all the samples) and shipping them off all over the nation. Fortunately, that still left us with maybe ¼ of them so we could have plenty for our own parties and selves! Oh gosh I miss those cookies: the little almond paste, green colored wreaths with egg white on top, 3 red cinnamon dots and 'holly leaves' made from green cherries. Luminarias. Taking turns, unwrapping gifts one by one, from each person around the room. Stockings in the Salita (think "den"; that is "little living room in Spanish) to open (about noon finally after the traditional Triangle Ranch Christmas breakfast of little pig sausages, Zimmit Kuhen (German coffee cake), orange juice, fresh grapefruit, and coffee in the living room first.

And always, always the power of family under the watchful eye of the precious angel.
Beloved, Christmas is for children. The child in all of us



I hope your sense of wonder glows this season. I hope you find and feel someone you love looking at you with warmth. And, more than that, I hope you feel His presence born again in you!
