WORSHIP & MUSIC

We have had the pleasure of having a new piano in the sanctuary for the past several weeks on a trial basis. It is a beautiful instrument, but the session and the worship team feel that now is not the right time to spend over 20,000 on a piano. The other piano option that we had was unfortunately sold so we are again on the search for the right instrument for our space as the old piano does need to be replaced. As we shop for the right instrument, we are going to start our fundraising with the goal to raise approximately \$10,000 for the new piano and other worship and music needs. You will recall, we are selling keys that you can buy to honor or memorialize someone. The cost per key will be \$150, or if you purchase 3 or more keys (up to 12 keys), the cost per key will be \$125 per key. If you choose to buy all 13 keys of an octave, the price will be \$100 per key, or \$1300 for the entire octave. If we can sell all the keys, we will raise somewhere between \$9000 and \$13,000. We would appreciate your support of the music program and remember, you don't have to be a member to donate a key or two, let your friends and family know of this opportunity to support our ministry as well!
