## Finish the Race with Faith....

Scripture says, "***Set yourself to run the race with faith. And finish it with faithfulness.***"

Hebrews 12:1

So, where are we now? In the race set before us.....towards finding a new pastor, here's where we are:

At the start (August 1, 2018)..... We were off.....and the Session set a Self - Study Committee of three.....to gather the initial research required by our denomination. The national average for the entire, two-step process is....about 18 months (sometimes as few as nine but....it can be as many as three years or more). Our faithful trio talked with local wise persons, did a demographic survey, and carefully asked you.....what your thoughts and priorities are for us here at heritage. Do you remember the two town hall meetings?

Since then we have entered the final step of the process. The PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee; that is the original three but more added by the congregation in a meeting) after using all your input and coordinating research... has written the MIF (Minister Information Form), submitted it to COM (Committee on Ministry for Homestead Presbytery), and had it approved. Then it went to national (the PC/USA offices in Louisville, KY) and is now online....for potential candidates to find, and send their resumes to the PNC. Shortly there should be inquiries and even applications coming in for our faithful folks to search, pray through, and carefully select the candidate for your approval. (I spoke yesterday with our liaison to COM who wondered aloud/via phone of course....how the quarantine might affect searches nationally. No one but God really knows....right now...)

So that's one topic. Frankly, that is the topic I planned to write about right now. BUT....something else has happened to intervene. And it is affecting...*the whole world!*

The scripture still applies. God's Word always applies! Let's hear it again....expanded a bit: ***12 Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and temptation that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, <sup>2</sup> fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. <sup>3</sup> Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.***

How are you doing, faithful? Sincerely?? How are your spirits? It is scary; isn't it? How is your apprehension doing these days; are you anxious? Some are. Many are more than anxious and, with some folks able to trumpet their worry to the world, it is easy to get sucked in to the inter-web (sic) of human anxiety. I would argue it is maybe now at its worst since the Holocaust. (What a tangled web we weave.)

But stability of mind, peace of heart, and uplifting Spirit....is always, always, and all ways...the way through any quagmire, quicksand, "slough of Despond" (Have you read Bunyan's Pilgrim Progress?)

Paul encourages us to apprehend (catch a glimpse of or 'hear with our spirit') the witnesses in the cloud around us. They made it. So will we! This is not the end of the world....although we will surely be changed for this pandemic.

So let's 'continue the course set before us' ....with faith. Faithfully running....or walking if that is all we can do....to the finish line. Let us hold in our hearts those who may not finish the race with us. Let us be gentle with one another.

And read and hear GOOD news....all day long.  
All through the night.  
Until a new day dawns!
