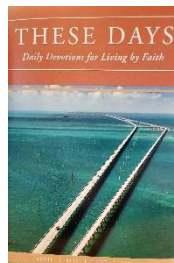

HERITAGE FREecycle

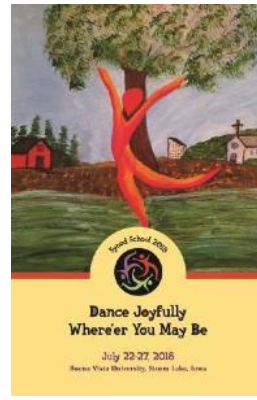
Heritage will be having another Freecycle event on Sunday, April 15 at 9:15 AM. Please bring items that you would like to give away and place them on the designated
