From the Session: June 2018

The search for our interim pastor started in December 2017, when the session met with the liaison from the Committee on Ministry (COM) to get everything started. We created a "MIF", which is a Ministry Information Form about our church and the qualities we would like in an interim pastor. Pastors create a "PIF", which means Pastor Information Form. The acronyms alone almost did us in!!

Once we got our MIF out there, we started receiving PIF's. We had about 30 applicants to sift through. The Session got together and were able to eliminate some applicants based on them not having previous experience or not having the interim training. We decided on six candidates to interview, but we only ended up interviewing four (one already had a job and one wanted a more permanent job), three over the phone and one in person.

Of the four we interviewed, we had one candidate that we really "clicked" with. After a very long process of approvals, and negotiations, we were able to offer to Jeff Hopson and he has accepted. Jeff comes to us from Stockton, California most recently, where he has been the pastor at First Congregational Church since 2008. He is originally from New Mexico and Oklahoma. He holds degrees from Oklahoma State University and Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.

Jeff plans to start August 1 (pending finalization of contract) and will be working Sunday- Tuesday. Session will be working on a plan if pastoral care is needed while he is not in the office. We hope you will all join us in welcoming Jeff to Lincoln and to Heritage.

From Amber Rumbaugh (Administrative Assistant):

I want to start this by saying THANK YOU! The transition that we will all experience is a huge learning curve for me being that I am from a RCA (Reformed Churches in America) Church and am still learning the ins and outs of a PC (USA) Church. The one thing I do know for sure is that everyone has been more than willing to offer assistance and guidance which will make this transition easier for me.

As you can see, the newsletter is about a week late. The reasoning for this is last week I attended an APA Conference in Minneapolis, MN. What is APA? I said the same thing when Ray suggested that I attend. There began my Google search to find out what APA was and how this conference would benefit me. This was one of the best things I could have done given the transition that Heritage Presbyterian is experiencing.

APA stands for Administrative Personnel Association of the Presbyterian Church. The mission of the APA is to offer opportunities for professional development and personal growth for those called by God to serve as support staff of the Presbyterian Church. This mission is accomplished by providing continuing education events for certification and occasions for fellowship, worship and spiritual nurture and prayer at both National and Regional meetings as well as seminary sponsored training events.

During the APA Conference I attended classes that included Presbyterian Polity, Churches and persons with disabilities, and a class that I think will be most helpful, Interim Ministries. Not only did these classes help me gain knowledge about the PC (USA) but I met so many Administrative Assistants whom seem to wear many hats and will be a great network of people if I feel "lost".

So once again thank you for the opportunity to grow and learn. I will leave you with a quote that was given to me at the conference. "Every day you have the opportunity to learn and experience something and some-one new. Learn and experience everything you can, and use it to change the world."


ONGOING YOUTH FUNDRAISERS PLEASE SAVE BEST CHOICE UPCS AND USED PRINTER CARTRIDGES
